The American Academy of Pediatrics developed the medical home as a model of delivering primary care to every child and adolescent that is accessible, continuous, comprehensive, family-centered, coordinated, compassionate, and culturally effective. A pediatric medical home is a family-centered partnership within a community-based system that provides uninterrupted care with appropriate payment to support and sustain optimal health outcomes. Medical homes address preventative, acute, and chronic care from birth through transition to adulthood. A medical home facilitates an integrated health system with an interdisciplinary team of patients and families, primary care physicians, specialists and subspecialists, hospitals and healthcare facilities, public health and the community.
