# Overview

- Fully accessible and comprehensible language
  - Follows age-appropriate acquisition and developmental milestones
- Continued delays in language lead to early interventionists struggling to find solutions and strategies to ‘close the gap.’
- A key factor in closing the gap is effective evaluation
  - Giving professionals data from which interventions can be designed

# Language Development

- Home language environment
- The impact that the home language environment has on linguistic and social emotional development
- Average three-year-old Deaf child's language development
- Limited or no access to visual language
- Impact of a fully accessible and comprehensible language
